Woodcrest Commons residents recently visited one of the few remaining working museums in North America, the Original American Kazoo Company, which was established in Eden in 1916.

The museum highlights the instrument's history and shows how kazoos are made step by step, and features wooden, silver and gold kazoos, liquorbottle shaped kazoos to celebrate the end of Prohibition, antique kazoo instruments, as well as a Make-Your-Own Kazoo station.

Self-guided tours are available for free Mondays through Saturdays, and visitors can view kazoos being made on the original equipment on weekdays until 3 p.m.
