Historic carriage returns to Rochester

More than 140 years after leaving the Cunningham Carriage Factory on Litchfield Street in Rochester, New York, a late-19th century brougham-style carriage has returned home. After sitting vacant for 25 years, DePaul is getting ready to re-open the doors of the former Cunningham Carriage Factory as 71 mid-market loft apartments.
