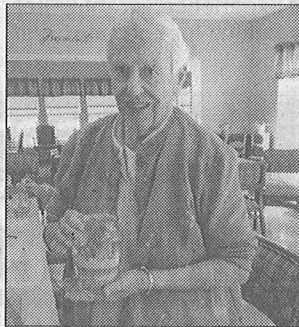
## Crafting to GROW

Green thumbs at Woodcrest Commons in Henrietta have been creating terrariums — the latest indoor gardening trend.

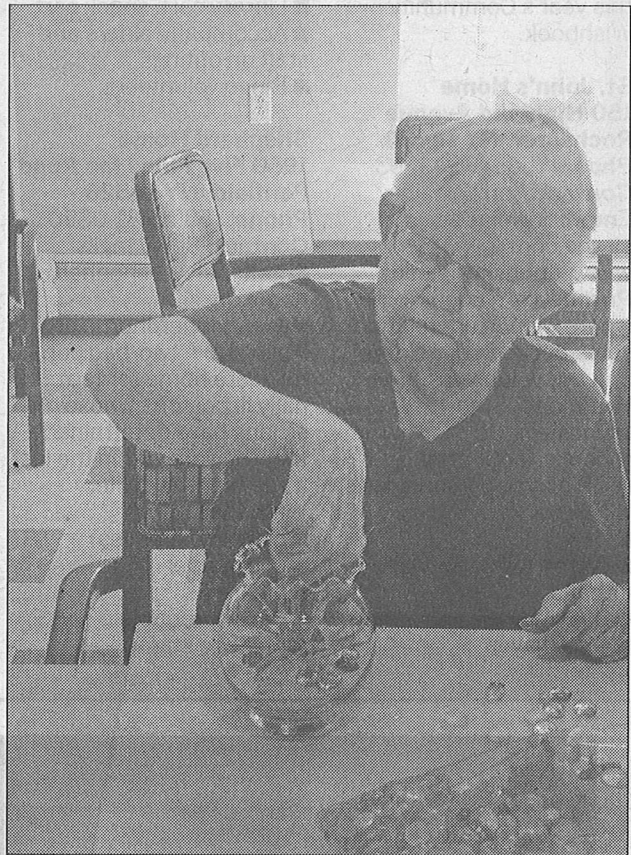

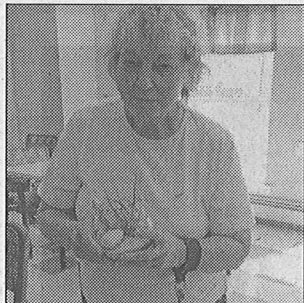
