"The residents and I have decided that if it's not going to look and feel like spring outside, we will do everything we can to make it spring inside," said Activities Director Lindsay Lohn.

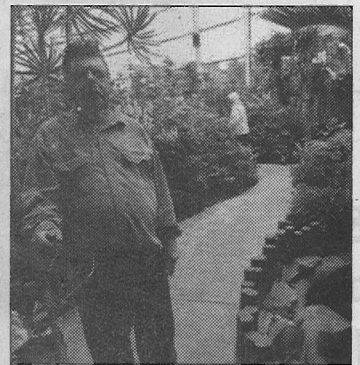
