A special ribbon-cutting ceremony was held for the Upper Falls Square Apartments on Hudson Avenue.

One building was dedicated to the late Ellen Stubbs, a nurse at the Jordan Health Center. The second building was named for Minister Raymond Scott and Maxine Scott, who are longtime community activists in Rochester.

Approximately 1/3 of the apartments will be occupied by early November. All of them are expected to be filled by Christmas.
