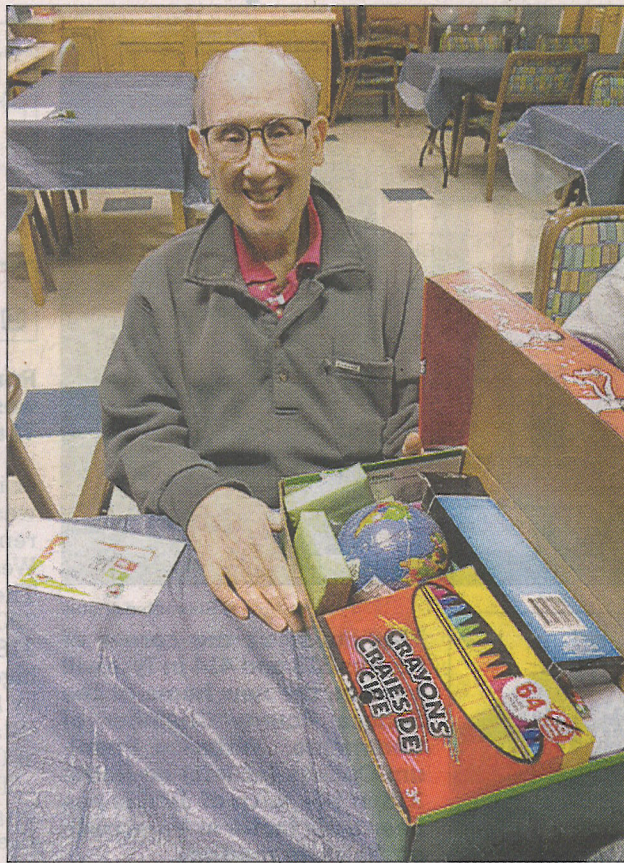
— Horizons residents helped make the holidays brighter for children affected by war, poverty, disaster, famine and disease through Operation Christmas Child.
