Governor Hochul Announces Opening of \$37 Million Affordable Housing Development in Erie County

The Apple Blossom Apartments in Cheektowaga Feature 110 Affordable Homes for Low-Income Households and Adults in Need of Supportive Services

# Sustainably Designed Buildings Accommodate Residents with Hearing or Visual Impairments and Residents with Physical Disabilities

Governor Kathy Hochul today announced the opening of a \$37 million affordable and supportive housing development in the town of Cheektowaga. Apple Blossom Apartments offers 110 affordable homes with 60 apartments for individuals in need of supportive services.

"The coronavirus pandemic created unprecedented challenges for New Yorkers already struggling with housing insecurity," **Governor Hochul said**. "Providing individuals and families with a safe and secure home is transformative and benefits the entire community. Apple Blossom Apartments is truly a welcome addition to Western New York."

Apple Blossom Apartments consists of three buildings named after apples grown in New York State - Gala, Empire and Cortland. All apartments are affordable to households earning at or below 60 percent of the Area Median Income.

Forty-eight homes are reserved for individuals who are eligible to receive on-site mental health treatment services, licensed by the New York State Office of Mental Health (OMH) under the Apartment Treatment Program. Twelve additional supportive homes are funded through the Empire State Supportive Housing Initiative (ESSHI) and administered by OMH. The remaining 50 apartments are set aside for income-eligible households. There are 28 apartments with ADA accessibility and 45 apartments with hearing and vision accessibility throughout the development.

The development complex was designed in compliance with the Energy Star Certified Homes Program path with input from the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority, which incorporates energy efficient building material and Energy Star appliances throughout the project.

Each of the three buildings feature a community room with kitchen, resident lounges with computer access, laundry rooms on each floor, and storage areas within each apartment. Meeting rooms in each building accommodate tenant support services.

Apple Blossom Apartments is located close to grocery shopping, schools, places of worship, medical care, banks, libraries, and government agencies.

DePaul Community Services is the service provider and developer. Financing for Apple Blossom Apartments includes \$19.2 million in permanent tax-exempt bonds, Federal Low-Income Housing Tax Credits that generated \$9.7 million in equity, and nearly \$12.8 million in subsidy from New York State Homes and Community Renewal. OMH provided \$13 million in construction funding, as well start-up funding through a \$120,000 Project Development Grant. OMH is also providing \$300,000 in annual support services funding through the ESSHI program. NYSERDA provided \$86,000.

Apple Blossom Apartments is part of the state's unprecedented \$20 billion, five-year Housing Plan to make housing accessible and combat homelessness by building or preserving more than 100,000 affordable homes and 6,000 with supportive services.

HCR Commissioner RuthAnne Visnauskas said, "We are so pleased to welcome home more than 110 new residents to the Apple Blossom Apartments in Cheektowaga. Thanks to DePaul and our partners in state government, this \$37 million housing community will enhance the everyday lives of adults in need of support services. All New Yorkers deserve to live affordably and comfortably in homes that meet their unique needs, and it is our mission at HCR to expand access to quality housing opportunities like the Apple Blossom Apartments in every region of the state."
