ePaul, New York State Homes and Community Renewal, the New York State Office of Mental Health, elected officials, community representatives and other partners gathered for a groundbreaking ceremony for the Mosaic Apartments in Schenectady in November 2023.

The two-building development will create 60 newly constructed apartments in the Mont Pleasant neighborhood. The all-electric, energy-efficient development includes 30 apartments with supportive services reserved for NYS Empire State Supported Housing Initiative (ESSHI).

The Mosaic Apartments are part of Governor Kathy Hochul's \$25 billion comprehensive Housing Plan that will create or preserve 100,000 affordable homes across New York, including 10,000 with support services for vulnerable populations, plus the electrification of an additional 50,000 homes.



DePaul's Reintegration Support Team



stablished in 2019, the DePaul Reintegration Support Team (DRST) is a multidisciplinary team that supports DePaul's mental health residential programs in Erie County. The DRST assists residents in their recovery journey, helping them acclimate to new living situations and obtain necessary living skills that empower them to achieve the highest level of independence possible.

The DRST operates a store at Seneca Square in Buffalo run by resident volunteers. There are plans to expand the store to other DePaul Single Room Occupancy (SRO) programs this year. In addition, the team provides various groups at the Erie County SRO programs Monday through Thursday. Group topics are decided collaboratively and have included cooking and nutrition, self-care, social skills, wellness tools, arts and crafts, and overcoming obstacles.

he National Council on Alcoholism and Drug Dependence-Rochester Area's (NCADD-RA) 78th Annual Luncheon will take place from 11:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 15 at the DoubleTree by Hilton in Rochester. Keynote speaker Dr. Stephen L. Dewey will present "Understanding the Science of Substance Use Disorder." Dr. Dewey received his Ph.D. from the University of Iowa and completed his postdoctoral fellowship in the Neurology Department at Stony Brook University. During his 23-year tenure at Brookhaven National Laboratory, he conducted research on the effects of addictive drugs on the human brain. Dr. Dewey has published more than 250 peer-reviewed scientific research articles, book chapters, and abstracts.
